NOT FORGOTTEN: CELEBRATING OUR VIETNAM VETERANS

Just before U.S. Navy veteran Harold Lincoln and his wife, Mary, walked down the red carpet at the Groundbreaking for their home last year, Mary turned to her husband and said, "This is for you."

The crowds, the welcome, the celebration—it was a long-awaited welcome home that many Vietnam veterans like Harold never got the chance to have. Harold served in the U.S. Navy from 1955-1957 and has service-connected disabilities including hearing loss, tinnitus, and a skin condition.

Harold became a project foreman after serving in the U.S. Navy, and work eventually landed the family in Waco, Texas, where Harold and Mary raised eight children. In 2021, an electrical fire badly damaged their home of 47 years. That's when Operation Finally Home, along with BAM Builders and sponsor, H-E-B Operation Appreciation, got involved.

At first, the project was considered a modification, but the project team quickly determined a new home was in order. The Lincoln family got the keys to their custom-built home on April 5, 2023.

"We've been away from home almost two years," Mary said. "The home is more than what I imagined. You did a wonderful job. It's beautiful."

Like Harold, U.S. Army Staff Sergeant Alvin Jackson also served during the Vietnam War. Drafted in 1968, the Tennessee native spent 13 months in Vietnam from May 1969 to June 1970. In addition, he served nearly 20 years as a member of the U.S. Army National Guard.

A cancer survivor twice over himself, Alvin and his wife, Zandra, who is currently battling cancer, live in Cleveland, Tennessee.

In 2018, a tree fell on the Jacksons' home, causing significant damage. Operation Finally Home, along with Lowe's, the Ocoee Region Builders Association and a host of friends, family members and neighbors helped dedicate the Jacksons' new custom-built home on August 5.

"I can't even describe my emotions," Zandra said at the dedication. "It's been a long time."


















HONORED TO SERVE

BEHIND THE BUILD

Not sure how an Operation Finally Home project comes to life? Here's a brief overview of our process.



ENLIST THE BUILDER

Every Operation Finally Home project begins with a builder. Once a builder has committed to the project, they help determine the location and general home plan.

SELECT A FAMILY

We pair each builder with a specific family. Families are selected from applications and fully vetted by caseworkers. Operation Finally Homes provides a family need assessment to help shape the plans to meet the family's specific needs.



FINALIZE PLANS & BUDGET

Operation Finally Home and the builder work to finalize home plans based on the family need assessment and other factors. A town hall meeting helps to finalize the budget and funding needs.

PILLAR EVENTS

After the builder and family are chosen, the project team marks milestone events as the build or home modification continues. These events allow recipients to celebrate every project milestone while also giving them time to absorb the magnitude of the gift of a home. Typically, there are four pillar events for each project.

1. SURPRISE

The selected family-usually thinking they are attending a meeting as part of the application process—is surprised with the news that they've already been selected to receive a mortgage-free home or home modification. This is sometimes held in conjunction with the Groundbreaking.









2. GROUNDBREAKING

The family, along with the builder, contractors and other project sponsors as well as neighbors and community members, gather at the selected home site to break ground on the veteran or first responder's new home.



3. NOTES OF LOVE

Neighbors and community members join Operation Finally Home, the builder and other project sponsors in writing inspirational and encouraging notes on the unfinished studs and framing of the home. Later, the family arrives to read the notes.







4. DEDICATION

When the project is completed, the families receive the keys at a special dedication and ribbon-cutting event. The builder, contractors, and other project sponsors-along with neighbors, community members and community leaders—gather to prayerfully dedicate the home and celebrate with the family.
