FAMILY MAN: RUSTY CARROLL'S LEGACY

Rusty Carroll had a way of making people feel like family from the first moment he met them.

"Rusty profoundly touched the lives of everyone he met," said Dan Wallrath, founder of Operation Finally Home. "He was deeply devoted to the mission of Operation Finally Home and committed to making a lasting impact on the lives of veterans, first responders and their families. His legacy will live on for generations."

Rusty, Operation Finally Home President, passed away on Dec. 30, 2024, after a hard-fought battle with cancer. He leaves behind his loving wife of 31 years, Deedra; their sons, Cameron (Alyssa) and Carson (Leslie); his parents, brothers, sistersin-law, nieces, nephew and in-laws, as well as his Operation Finally Home family.

Rusty began his career at Louisiana-Pacific (now LP Building Solutions), where he held several sales and marketing leadership positions. His 20-year journey with LP began in Conroe, Texas, and took his family to Montreal, Quebec, and eventually to Nashville and Spring Hill, where he and Deedra raised their sons.

He joined Operation Finally Home in 2013 and played a key role in growing the nonprofit. Under his leadership, the organization expanded from providing mortgage-free homes for veterans to include assistance for first responders, home modifications, and transitional housing.

A natural-born leader, Rusty's life was centered around his faith, family, friends, and serving others. He poured his energy into coaching baseball, serving as president of the Rotary Club, contributing to various community organizations and enjoying the outdoors—whether on his boat, *It's About Time*, in a kayak, camping, golfing, hunting or fishing.

A FEW WORDS FROM DAN

When I began Operation Finally Home in 2005, our mission was much the same as it is today: to provide safe homes for America's heroes. Over the years, that mission has expanded to include custom-built, mortgage-free homes, home modifications and transitional housing for our country's veterans, first responders and their families.

By 2013, God had blessed Operation Finally Home in so many ways, and I desperately needed help. God, in his infinite wisdom, placed Rusty Carroll in my path when I needed him most.

In the eight years before Rusty came on board, we had provided 36 mortgage-free homes and one home modification. In the 11 and a half years of Rusty's tenure, we have completed an additional 236 custom homes, more than 100 home modifications and built 15 tiny homes. This is undoubtedly a testament to God placing Rusty in this position and calling him to this work.

Beyond the bricks and mortar, Rusty built lasting relationships with everyone he met. In the days after his death, Operation Finally Home recipients and their families, builders and those within the building industry left message after message on social media detailing how Rusty had touched their lives, making an impact in a conversation, an action or a laugh. Rusty paid attention to the people around him, and he made us all feel seen, loved and respected.

Rusty regarded his work at Operation Finally Home as a divine calling. He was a man of deep faith in God, whose direction and leadership he sought daily. For me, watching Rusty accomplish what he was called to do was a blessing and an honor.

Rusty's legacy will live on in the lives he touched. Let us continue to work and honor his life by embracing one another with the same compassion and love he showed us. In the words of Matthew 25, words I'm sure Rusty heard: "Well done, my good and faithful servant."
